


ST. PATRICK'S DAY DINNER

REMINDER TO DOG OWNERS

Municipal Code 4.10.035 Removal of Dog Waste.

No person shall allow a dog owned by or under the person’s control to defecate on property other than the owner’s without immediately thereafter picking up and disposing of the excrement.
