

55 ALIVE – SAFE DRIVING FOR SENIORS

This year's safe driving classes will be held May 14 and May 21 from 1 to 4 p.m. at the North Plains Senior Center. **Anyone is eligible to take the course; you don't have to be 55.** As a result of evidence-based research findings, the course has been adjusted to include a focus on areas where older drivers could benefit from additional training, including Oregon-specific rules of the road, roundabouts, pavement markings, stop-sign compliance, red-light running and safety issues. Cost for the 55 ALIVE course is \$12 for AARP members and \$14 for non-members. And remember, check with your insurance agent. You'll likely save money on your insurance rates. 

Those were the good old days...


The Mays Brothers mercantile store dates back to 1892 when it was being operated by Clarence and Elmer Mays along with their

father J.R. The Mays bought the store in Glencoe from John Fowler.

In 1911, the store was moved from Glencoe to North Plains and then was located where the parking lot is today between the North Plains Market and the Last Waterin' Hole (aka "the Lower" tavern).

We are told that during this move from Glencoe, progress was halted by bad weather that persisted. The store was opened for business right where it was stopped until conditions improved.

Clarence Mays left for another venture and Marion Mays came into the business. Lester Cypher worked for the Mays Brothers and in time married Elmer Mays' daughter, Delta.

After the Pythian Hall was built, the store was moved from the old Glencoe building to the lower floor of the Pythian building in 1915. Marion Mays became ill, and Henry Cypher came on board. I first recall the Mays Brothers store in the 1930s when it was being operated by Lester and Henry Cypher. It was still then under the Pythian Hall. The same area is used by the Treasure Chest Antique Mall today.

I was in the store with my father in the 1940s when Henry Cypher called me into the back. He said, "Son, I've got something for you here just your size," and he gave me a 4-10 shotgun. They had probably taken the gun in on a trade, but I'll never forget that gift. Out of

respect, Henry Cypher's funeral was the first I ever attended when I was a kid.

I can remember the old Glencoe Store building. I believe the top floor had been removed. The building was being used for feed, storage, and was also the location for the machinery business. Mays Brothers store was a dealer for International Harvester farm



equipment. My parents bought a McCormick-Deering 10-20 tractor and several tillage implements there.

Hayden Brisbane

worked for the Cyphers, and one of his jobs was to assemble farm machinery that was delivered in the lot behind the old store building. Somewhere in the past, Hayden had received police or F.B.I. training. One fall day, the county dog catcher had too much to drink and was shouting and waving a pistol around Commercial Street. Hayden Brisbane was the man that went out and restored order.

The Cyphers kept a lot of people on credit. They had a book on many. Another story that has been handed down is of an old timer who asked Lester and Henry to be pall bearers at his funeral. He told them, "You boys have carried me for years and years, you might as well finish the job."

Ross Cox married Lester Cypher's daughter Margaret around 1941. Ross served in the military during World War II and after the war was joined in the grocery business. The building there today, next to the Pythian Hall, was built, and the store moved into it. Ross and Margaret were spark plugs, and the store did a booming business.

My older brother, Nolan, drove a delivery van for Davidson's Bakery out of Portland for over 30 years. During the strawberry season, he could not have enough bread, along with his other deliveries, to keep



the Mays Brothers store supplied. He would have to meet a re-supply truck and make

two deliveries to the store each day.

Many people had a few acres of strawberries back then, and everyone was making lunches. There was for a time a large strawberry processing plant, Scenic Fruit, located on Commercial where the Gratemaster is today.

Often, good things come to an end, and in the fall of 1967, the Mays Brothers store was sold by Lester Cypher and Ross and Margaret Cox to the Fergusons of Lake Oswego. The store had been in the family for 75 years.

Lester Cypher always called me "Son," but then again, he called almost every man "Son!" He was entitled to it.
