

ANNUAL CLEAN-UP DAY MAY 14, 2011

The City of North Plains Annual City-Wide Clean-Up Day will be from 8:00 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. Clean-Up Day is only for residents within the city limits of North Plains. Clean-Up Day is made available by a grant from Metro and matching funds from the city. All donations to help meet the matching funds should be made at City Hall and are greatly appreciated. Residents may bring their unwanted items (no wet or household garbage) to the parking lot of the Jessie Mays Community Hall at 30975 NW Hillcrest Street on the corner of NW 311th Avenue and NW Hillcrest Street. All items must be bundled or boxed.

\$4.00 per car load and \$8.00 per truck, trailer, or van load

\$4.00 per tire and \$6.00 per tire with wheel.

\$5.00 per large appliance and \$25.00 per Freon appliance.

\$20.00 per half full mid-size pickup and \$40.00 per full mid-size pickup for heavy items, such as brick or rock.

If you have a physical condition and/or need assistance removing your unwanted items for disposal, please call City Hall at 503-647-5555 to schedule assistance. The drop boxes, hauling, and dumping fees are generously donated by Garbarino Disposal Service in conjunction with Metro Solid Waste and Recycling.

Please call City Hall if you would like to volunteer to help with Clean-Up Day.
